November 2022 Chosen Charity: *Home Suite Hope*

- Home Suite Hope unites a network of vital support services for single parents and their children; encouraging and supporting them as they journey from poverty to stability.
- Poverty, and the hopelessness it fosters, is often passed on from one generation to the next. Children growing up in poverty learn to believe education and secure employment are beyond their reach. Without empowerment, they may not have the tools and support to think beyond their microcosm of despair.
- Homeward Bound Halton is a four-year wrap around program that provides housing, life skills, two-year college program, professional development, mentorships and employment supports.
- After all guaranteed funding is counted there is a short fall of \$9,543 needed to sponsor each of the families per year that must be attained through donations and fundraising efforts.
- Individuals and organization that donate the \$9,543 become partners in change and become part of the family's journey – receiving updates from the parent of the family they sponsor via letter or email.

November 2022 Presenting Charities



- September 2022 recipient received \$9,900 from 100WWCB
- Lisette shared that our funds were used for:
 - Woman paralysed from a hit & run spent years in care: \$1,842 provided her copay to get a wheelchair and go home – Gift of MOBILITY!
 - Cerebral Palsy & Autistic child: \$5,000 to retrofit their home with chairlift, hospital bed, kitchen access, etc
 - 3 iPads for complex care unit in Burlington for patient communication & accessibility
 - \$1,900 petty cash for in-care patients for haircuts, nail clippers, coffees, etc.

- With the Burlington Adult Day Program, they provide a caring, friendly environment for adults who are at risk of social isolation due to a diverse range of challenges.
- Funding would be used to host a DATE NIGHT held after hours at the Burlington Club for the club members and their caregivers. This is an event where they treat their families to a special night out that would otherwise not be possible. (They've done Date Nights in the past, always to rave reviews from all in attendance).

- Mission: To support and empower diverse learners through advocacy, education, and services
- We support any diverse learner who can benefit from our programs, with a primary focus on: Those with dyslexia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia, dyspraxia, non-verbal and other learning disabilities; Those with ADHD; Those with Level 1 Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD); Those with mental health issues that affect their learning.
- Funding would support approximately 20 students in accessing free literacy or math programming to bridge pandemic learning loss
- 1,500 kids supported annually
- 350 kids currently on a waitlist (103 in Burlington)
